AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE REGISTRATION SYSTEM OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ANIMALS IN THE BARANGAYS IN THE CITY OF MALAYBALAY

WHEREAS, Health and Welfare of Livestock: With a centralized database in place, the Barangay Livestock Registration Act can help ensure that all livestock owners are taking proper care of their animals through the technical guidance of the Malaybalay City Veterinary Office. The registration process will provide up to date livestock population inventory status and can also help monitor the livestock animal health status, preventing the spread of any animal diseases.

WHEREAS, Public and Animal Health: A centralized database of livestock information can help monitor the health and welfare of livestock in the city, ensuring that they are vaccinated, healthy, and not carrying any diseases that could be transmitted to other animals or humans.

WHEREAS, Safety and Security: A livestock registration program can help identify and locate livestock in the event of a disease outbreak, natural disaster, or other emergency. It can also ensure that all livestock are properly contained, preventing them from wandering onto public roads and causing accidents posing a risk to public safety.

WHEREAS, Economic Development: A livestock registration program can help promote the development of a sustainable livestock industry in the city, allowing for the proper planning and management of livestock production. This can lead to increased productivity, efficiency, and profitability for livestock owners.

WHEREAS, Barangay Livestock Registration Program is an important tool for promoting the health and welfare of livestock, ensuring public safety and promoting economic development. It is a vital component of responsible animal husbandry and sustainable agriculture, and can benefit the city and its residents in numerous ways and that the livestock industry can thrive.

ARTICLE I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Title: This city ordinance shall be known as the “**Barangay Livestock Registration Ordinance.**”

Section 2. Definition of Terms: For the purpose of this city ordinance, the following terms are defined as follows:

- a. Barangay – refers to the smallest administrative unit in the Philippines.
- b. Livestock – refers to any animal raised or kept for commercial, recreational or domestic purposes, including but not limited to pigs, cows, goats, horses, sheep, rabbit, carabao, poultry and fowls.
- c. Fowl – a type of livestock that specifically refers to domesticated birds, especially those raised for food or other purposes such as entertainment including but not limited to poultry and game fowls.
- d. Poultry – refers to domesticated birds kept for egg and meat.
- e. Livestock Owner – refers to any person or entity that owns, manages, or controls livestock animals.
- f. Poultry Owner – refers to any person or entity that owns, manages, or controls poultry animals.
- g. Game fowl - refers to breeds of domesticated chickens that are selectively bred for cockfighting.
- h. Livestock Registration – refers to the process of recording livestock information, such as type, breed, age, sex, and animal health status, to a centralized database.
- i. City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person – refers to an employee of the City Government of Malaybalay under the City Veterinary Office and be assigned to a specific local barangay of the City.
- j. Barangay Livestock Registration Certificate – refers to the document that certifies as proof of authentic ownership.
- k. Backyard scale livestock – consists of 5 heads and below of livestock animals
- l. Medium scale livestock – consists of 6 to 100 heads of livestock animals
- m. Commercial livestock – consists of more than 100 heads of livestock animals
- n. Backyard scale poultry – consists of 50 heads and below of poultry animals
- o. Medium scale poultry – consists of 51 – 100 heads of poultry animals
- p. Commercial scale poultry – consists of more than 100 heads of poultry animals

Section 3. Scope: This ordinance shall cover the registration and monitoring of livestock and poultry animals in the City of Malaybalay. Game fowls shall not be covered by this ordinance for the reason that it is not being domesticated for egg and meat purposes.

ARTICLE II. OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES

Section 4. Livestock Registration Requirement:

- 4.a. All backyard and medium scale livestock and poultry owners within the jurisdiction of the Barangay shall be required to register their livestock to the City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person. The registration shall be done within the

first quarter of the year and updated quarterly. Newly purchased or sold livestock animal must be registered as soon as possible.

- 4.b. Barangay Local Government Units may establish registration fee ordinances to cover operational expenses for registration. Said fees, shall not exceed twenty pesos (P20.00) per transaction.

Section 5. Creation of City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person. For purposes of the implementation of this Ordinance, A City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person shall be created.

Section 6. Roles & Responsibilities of the City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person. The City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person will be detailed at the Local Barangay and shall coordinate, assist and help facilitate all activities, events and programs of the City Veterinary Office and act as official representatives of the City Veterinary Office at their assigned barangay and shall maintain a centralized database to record all livestock registration information and assist in the issuance of the Barangay Livestock Registration Certificate as acknowledgement.

This database shall be accessible to the public and shall include the following information:

- a. Name and address of the livestock owner
- b. Type of livestock
- c. Breed of livestock
- d. Age of livestock
- e. Sex of livestock
- f. Health status of livestock

The Barangay Livestock Registration Focal Person shall also keep a record of any changes in the livestock registration information, such as changes in ownership, transfers, or deaths.

Section 7. Issuance of Barangay Livestock Certificate. Any backyard livestock or poultry sale transaction shall require the barangay registration certificate as a pertinent document for legal purposes, such as shipping, slaughter, and issuance of Veterinary Health Certificate requirement.

Section 8. Disease Monitoring System. A Disease Monitoring System shall be enabled to prevent the movement, transport, slaughter or sale of sick animals in order to prevent the spread of highly infectious disease

Section 9. Issuance of Veterinary Health Certificate. No livestock animal shall be issued with Veterinary Health Certificate without the appropriate Barangay Livestock Registration Certificate.

Section 10. Standard and Regulations Component: This city ordinance seeks to promote the development of a sustainable livestock industry and to protect the health and welfare of livestock in the Barangay and also to bolster the technical assistance provided by the City Veterinary Office through the City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person. It is the aim of this act to establish a system for the registration of livestock, for solid population inventory for data gathering and monitoring, promotion of responsible animal husbandry and accurate record of all types of livestock in the barangay throughout the City of Malaybalay.

Section 11. Penalty Clause:

- A. Non-registration of livestock or poultry animals shall be punishable with the following penalties:

A.1. For individuals:

- 1st Offense: P500.00 or one day community service
 2nd Offense: P1,000.00 or two days community service
 3rd Offense: P3, 000.00
 4th and Subsequent Offenses: P5, 000.00

A.2. For companies/corporations:

- 1st Offense: P500.00 or one day community service
- 2nd Offense: P1,000.00 or two days community service
- 3rd Offense: P3,000.00
- 4th and Subsequent Offenses: P5,000.00

B. Non-disclosure of sales. Non-declaration of sales to the City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Focal Person shall be punishable with the following penalties:

B.1. For individuals:

- 1st Offense: P500.00 or one day community service
- 2nd Offense: P1,000.00 or two days community service
- 3rd Offense: P3,000.00
- 4th and Subsequent Offenses: P5,000.00

B.2. For companies/corporations:

- 1st Offense: P500.00 or one day community service
- 2nd Offense: P1,000.00 or two days community service
- 3rd Offense: P3,000.00
- 4th and Subsequent Offenses: P5,000.00

This ordinance shall be included in the Ordinance Violation Receipt (OVR).

Section 12. Budgetary Requirements: Upon approval of this ordinance, the city shall procure necessary equipment such as electronic tablet devices and laptop computers to be used by the City Veterinary Office Barangay Extension Offices for accurate record keeping. The city shall allocate annual funds to support this ordinance.

Section 13. Separability Clause: Should any of the provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other remaining portions not so declared shall remain valid and effective.


Section 14. Effectivity Clause: This Ordinance shall take effect after compliance with posting at prominent places in the city and on the bulletin board of forty-six (46) barangays for a period of three (3) consecutive weeks and publication in a newspaper of local circulation.
