AN ORDER CANCELLING THE CLASSES IN ALL LEVELS FOR PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS IN THE CITY OF MALAYABLAY, BUKIDNON DUE TO HEAVY RAINFALL

WHEREAS, DOST PAGASA Mindanao Heavy Rainfall Warning No. 32 issued on 5:30 am of February 2, 2024 placed Malaybalay City under the Yellow Warning Level ((Heavy rains);

WHEREAS, Presidential Executive Order No. 66, s. 2012, authorizes the local chief executives, as Chairpersons of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, to cancel or suspend classes in their jurisdiction in the absence of typhoon warnings from PAGASA;

WHEREAS, the Malaybalay City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office has recommended to the undersigned the suspension/ cancellation of classes in all levels in the City of Malaybalay due to the heavy rainfall;

WHEREAS, there is a need to suspend/ cancel classes in all levels in private and public schools in Malaybalay City, Bukidnon to ensure the safety of all the pupils and students;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Warren R. Pabillaran, City Mayor of Malaybalay City, Bukidnon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, hereby order the CANCELLATION of classes in all levels in both private and public schools in the City of Malaybalay, Bukidnon.

Subject: Urgent Appeal for Immediate Class All Levels and Government Office Cancellation Due to Yellow Warning Level Heavy Rainfall

Dear Mayor Pabillaran,

I urgently bring to your attention the current Yellow Warning Level Heavy Rainfall in our area, as highlighted in PAGASA's Heavy Rainfall Warning No. 32 #MIN_PRSD issued on February 2, 2024, at 5:30 AM. This warning indicates potential flooding and landslides, especially in #Bukidnon and nearby areas.

In line with Executive Order No. 66, s. 2012 Section 3, I, as the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer, recommend the immediate cancellation of all classes and work in government offices until weather conditions improve. The continuous heavy rainfall poses risks such as flooding, slippery roads, and potential landslides.

Swift action is crucial to ensure the safety of our students, school staff, and the community. Your prompt attention to this matter is greatly appreciated.
